## Easter Day Communion Celebration

### ***Part 1: On Avon Beach: Greetings and renewal of baptismal vows.***

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

**I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

**I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

**I come to Christ.**

your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

*We say sorry*

Jesus Christ, risen Saviour and triumphant Lord, we come to  
you to confess to you our weakness and unbelief.

Like Mary at the empty tomb,  
we fail to grasp the wonder of your presence  
Lord have mercy. **Lord have mercy**

Like the disciples behind locked doors  
we are afraid to be seen as your followers  
Christ have mercy. **Christ have mercy**

Like Thomas in the upper room  
we are slow to believe.  
Lord have mercy. **Lord have mercy**

May the God of love and power forgive *you* and free *you* from  
*your* sins, heal and strengthen *you* by his Spirit,

## ***The Eucharistic Prayer***

**Lord of life, with unbounded joy we offer you our sacrifice of praise. As we are fed with the bread of heaven may we know your resurrection power; through Christ our risen Lord.**

**We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

It is always right to give you thanks,  
God our Creator, loving and faithful, holy and strong.  
You made us and the whole universe,  
and filled your world with life.

You sent your Son to live among us, Jesus our Saviour, Mary's child. He suffered on the cross;  
he died to save us from our sins;  
he rose in glory from the dead.

You send your Spirit to bring new life to the world,  
and clothe us with power from on high.

And so we join all the angels  
and saints to celebrate and say:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Father, on the night before he died,

and share the good news of Jesus,  
as we wait for his coming in glory.
