

Make a scroll


You will need: large lolly sticks; paper; coloured pens

Make a scroll out paper and large lolly sticks. Glue the sticks on to the top and bottom of the paper.

Then write on to the scroll the words of 1 Peter 3:15–16 (NLT):

‘If someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it. But do this in a gentle and respectful way.’

This verse helps us to remember how we can tell people about Jesus, and how we find out more as we go along to Messy Church.
