UNLOCK YOUR POTENTIAL...

We've just returned from a canal boat holiday, and I've discovered muscles I never knew I had whilst unlocking and locking the locks with a windlass (never heard of that before either!) I was struck by the fact that it was usually the women who managed the locks whilst the menfolk steered the boats – an arrangement amicably agreed upon I'm sure! It was reminiscent of my times in India when it was always the women who went to the well to fetch water... and have a good natter on their own.

In our Gospel reading this morning, Jesus helps two women to 'unlock their potential' – one a twelve year old girl at the beginning of her womanhood who was weak and had fallen into a deep sleep, and an older woman who'd been debilitated for twelve years. When Jesus heals people, I always want to ask: 'What did they do next?' With renewed energy, did they go on to do great things, acts of kindness and generosity, stand up for themselves in a patriarchal society? We hope so, don't we, and we pray that we will make full use of our potential: the gifts, skills and talents that Jesus unlocks for us.
