Born in Jamaica, he lived there until he was 5; his father was murdered when he was 2; he emigrated with his mum to London; he attended a school in Wembley; behavioural problems led to him attending a special school; he was arrested and cleared on a couple of occasions; he made a 'substantial' donation to Grenfell Tower victims; he was awarded MBE 2021 for services to racial equality in sport... a chequered CV to put it mildly. I've missed out all his sporting achievements, for you to guess who this person is?



Yes, it's Raheem Sterling who scored a crucial goal for England in their 2-0 defeat of Germany last week! Seeing the arches of Wembley Stadium from his school, he dreamt of playing there one day. His teachers remember him well, though probably not all saintly memories! Sterling says: 'I'm not 100% religious but my belief is strong. When the time is right, I will fully be Christian.' He adds that he puts his faith in God and prays regularly.

An imperfect individual, as we all are, but loved by God, as we all are. He's a young man who's persisted against the odds and made good, and hopefully he will continue to do so (he's only 26). When the glitz and glamour of being a world-class footballer has long gone, may he continue to be a 'local lad' who remembers his roots, and does a lot of good for others with the wealth that he's accumulated.
